## ACTIVITY REPORT : 2024

On 27th January, a meal was served and ration kits were distributed to the residents of the Blind Colony, ensuring they received essential support For their daily S.....









On February 1, 2024, Hope Welfare Trust launched a multifaceted initiative in Mathura aimed at addressing the needs of underprivileged children living in slum areas. This initiative encompassed the feeding of slum children and the establishment of an education centre, reflecting the organization's commitment to holistic community development and support for vulnerable populations.





On February 2, 2024, Hope Welfare Trust organized a heartfelt feeding program at the leprosy home, demonstrating their commitment to supporting vulnerable communities with compassion and dignity. This initiative aimed to provide nutritious meals to residents of the leprosy home, ensuring their physical well-being and fostering a sense of care and solidarity.





On 15 Feb in a heart-warming gesture of celebration and empowerment, Ms. Sobhna Nerliker, the Dean of Banaras Hindu University's Mass Communication Department, distributed green sarees to 200 women. This thoughtful initiative aimed to honor and uplift women, while also promoting cultural heritage and solidarity within the community.





On February 27, 2024, a compassionate initiative took place in Ayodhya where sweaters were distributed to 50 underprivileged children. This gesture aimed to provide warmth and comfort to children from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, ensuring they are equipped to face the cold weather with dignity and resilience.



On 3rd March, approximately 400 women from the Green Group in Varanasi, Mirzapur, and Ayodhya visited Ayodhya to have darshan of Shri Ram and were overwhelmed. Additionally, a cleanliness program was conducted by the Green Army at Lata Mangeshkar Chowk in which Mayor Girishpati Tripathi and IPS Vipin Mishra from Ayodhya district participated.







On 20th March, Hope Welfare Trust is with BHU (Mass com.) department organized an awareness rally. Women from the Green Group carried out a rally with slogans like "Educated women, educated society; this will lead to the country's development," spreading awareness among people. Women should engage in sports along with their education; they have conveyed this message by participating in sports competitions.





On 30th March, with the help of Mukul Madhav Foundation, 51 TB patients in Chunar, Mirzapur, were taken care of, and nutrition kits were distributed. Senior officials from the health department, along with Sub-District Magistrate Rajesh Kumar Verma, were present.





On 15th April, the team from DMAI Finance visited Varanasi and met with the women of the Green Army to appreciate their work. They also visited the stitching center established by Hope and praised the products made by the women.



29April 2024. Our organization's goal is to provide quality education and nutritious food to the children of laborers working in the coal mines of Sonbhadra. These laborers cannot afford to give their children a good education and nutritious food due to their poor financial condition. Our team is continuously working in this area.





4 May 2024 Hope Welfare Trust, with the help of Mukul Madhav Foundation, adopted 51 TB patients in Chunar Tehsil, Mirzapur. The program was attended by the PHC chief and TB nodal officer.







04 May 2024 Hope Welfare Trust distributed essential items like tarpaulins, buckets, and ration kits to all those in need in Kushinagar district, following a devastating calamity.





21 May 2024 On May 20, 2024, our team distributed slippers to elderly and helpless individuals in the tribal areas of Sonbhadra and Mirzapur. These tribal people cannot afford to buy slippers as their income is derived from collecting and selling wood from the forest, which is insufficient to meet their needs.





20 May 2024 On May 21, 2024, our team identified children in the tribal areas of Sonbhadra and Mirzapur who walked to school barefoot and provided them with slippers.

On May 27, 2024, a public awareness rally was organized by young children, who carried banners and delivered messages to the community on how to make Kashi plastic-free.





02 June 2024 Under the joint initiative of Varanasi Municipal Corporation and Hope Welfare Trust, the "Green by Hope" program was launched, where discarded clothes near temples along the riverbanks in Varanasi are being recycled into bags by women at the sewing center. This initiative, led by Hope Welfare Trust and the municipal corporation, is a revolutionary step towards environmental protection.





05 June 2024 On June 5, 2024, women from the Green Group planted trees in their respective villages to keep the environment clean, while Hope Welfare Trust volunteers distributed 5000 cotton bags to keep Kashi clean.





21 June 2024 On the occasion of International Yoga Day, women from the Green Army conducted yoga sessions and went around villages raising awareness about the benefits of yoga with the slogan "Do Yoga, Stay Healthy."





26 June 2024 On June 26, 2024, our team visited Bada Gaon police station area, where 90% of the villagers were found to be involved in making and consuming illegal liquor. Under the leadership of ADCP IPS Akash Sir, the team appealed to everyone to stop producing illegal liquor. A Green Army team will be formed soon to completely eradicate addiction and gambling in these villages.



**27 June 2024** Deputy Police Commissioner of Varanasi, IPS Akash Ji, recently visited the Hope Sewing and Livelihood Center. During his visit, he commended the women for their outstanding work, particularly noting the innovative products crafted from discarded clothes. He praised their creativity, dedication, and the positive impact of their efforts.







02 July 2024 A meeting was held under "Green by Hope" on July 2, 2024, at Sev Puri Block, attended by the SDM, BDO, all village heads, and secretaries. The meeting suggested planting more trees along the Varuna River and discussed making the entire Varanasi a green city in collaboration with the public.





**07 July 2024** Phoolpur police station area. It was observed that every household was involved in making alcohol. The villagers were motivated to stop producing alcohol and were assured of employment opportunities in the future. The event was attended by the station head and the Hope team.





**14 July 2024** On July 14, 2024, 75 women from three villages in the Dafi area of Varanasi received self-defense training from the Green Army.



**17 July 2024** On July 17, 2024, a meeting was held with industrialists in Babatpur Industrial Area, which was attended by ADCP IPS Akash Patel. The industrialists agreed to promote self-employment.





**17 July 2024** On July 18, 2024, the team visited Karwal Basti in Phoolpur and met with IPS Akash Patel and the Thana Adhyaksh. IPS Akash Patel appealed to the people to give up illegal activities and join the mainstream.





**19 July 2024:** On July 19, 2024, Hope Welfare Trust distributed nutritious food and buckets to 51 TB patients at the Primary Health Center in Mirzapur's Chunar Tehsil.

**20 July 2024** On July 20, 2024, a community meeting was held in Muradev village, Varanasi, with ADCP Gomti IPS Akash Patel. During this event, IPS Akash Patel praised the women and assured them of all possible police assistance.



On July 30, 2024, food distribution was carried out in Sonbhadra and Mirzapur through Hope's initiative, Chachi Ki Chalti Rasoi.







On August 14, the women of the Green Army successfully achieved their target of distributing 500 national flags.





On 18th August, in Varanasi's Jansa area, 50 school bags were distributed to children from underprivileged backgrounds, supporting their education and ensuring they have essential resources to continue their studies effectively.





On August 21, 2024, a bag distribution drive was organized with the aim of making Varanasi plastic-free. The event witnessed the participation of Colonel Sandeep Sharma and officials from the Nagar Nigam. Handcrafted cloth jholas, made by the Green Group.





On 25th August, on the occasion of Krishna Janmashtami, the Green Army celebrated Krishna Janmashtami.

On September 24, 2024, nutrition kits were distributed to 51 TB patients. During the distribution, TB nodal officers educated the beneficiaries on preventive measures to combat this life-threatening disease. Additionally, an awareness campaign was conducted to inform the community about ways to prevent the spread of tuberculosis.





On September 28, 2024, ration kits were distributed to flood-affected boatmen by Hope Welfare Trust with the support of Mukul Madhav Foundation
